If parents want to give their children a gift, the best thing they can do is to teach their children to love challenges, be intrigued by mistakes, enjoy effort, and keep on learning. That way, their children don't have to be slaves of praise. They will have a lifelong way to build and repair their own confidence.'

A reminder that our Parent Teacher Evenings are coming up early in Term 3. These meetings provide an opportunity for you to meet with teachers for a face to face conversation to address any concerns that you have or to discuss how we can work together to best support your child with their learning. Please be aware that based on feedback from parents we have increased the time that teachers will be available for these important conversations. A reminder that you will need to use the online booking system to make your appointments (details of how to do this were included with reports). The reporting letter also included details about teacher availability (please note that Lauren Taylor will now be available for appointments on Tuesday evening which is an alteration to the information published in the letter sent home earlier in the week). Parent Teacher Evenings will be Monday 31st July 3.30-5.00 and Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> August 3.30-6.30. We look forward to meeting with parents and strongly encourage you to attend.

A highlight for me this week has been communication from quite a number of parents following the Mid-year report being sent home. It is so encouraging to have parents share positive feedback about the level of support and care their children receive at Riverside High School. These messages have overwhelmingly highlighted that our teachers 'go above and beyond the call of duty' to provide and ensure quality learning opportunities for our students. Both our teaching team and I really value parents taking the time to pass on their appreciation and any feedback that helps us to more effectively work with students.

Our average daily attendance is 90%. While attendance continues to be a focus for us, we know that we have very large numbers of students who have consistently high levels of attendance. This morning we have been able to recognise 140 students who have had 100% attendance at school this term. We know that it is not always possible to achieve this as our winter terms do impact more on ill health, but I would like to commend those students who have either been recognised with 100% attendance or who have maintained a very solid attendance record. Please be aware that during the holidays a printout of current attendance for this term will be sent home. This helps to ensure good communication about attendance and that our attendance record is accurate.

Mrs Patricia Beams has been a highly skilled member of our administration team and after 22 years of fantastic service to Riverside High School has decided to retire. Mrs Beams' 35 years service to the department also includes working at both Exeter High School and Macquarie District Office (now Learning Services). Mrs Beams is a passionate supporter of our school and has a long association with Riverside High School including being one of the earliest students of the school. Heavily involved in the organisation of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the school, Mrs Beams has a wealth of knowledge about the history of Riverside High and has often been called upon for her expertise in this area, On behalf of our school community I would like to sincerely thank Mrs Beams for her wonderful service and commitment to the school. We wish Mrs Beams a healthy and happy retirement.



We have very few staffing changes for next term, which provides great consistency for students. Mrs Lauren Taylor will be taking long service leave and Mrs Karen Bodell will be returning from her long service leave. Mr Cameron Downie, who has been taking Mrs Bodell's classes during this term will take on Mrs Taylor's teaching load in Term 3.

I would like to wish both students and staff a safe and happy holiday. I hope that people are able to relax and recharge ready for Term 3. We look forward to seeing students back at school on Tuesday  $25^{\rm th}$  July.

### SUBJECT IN FOCUS - COMPUTER GRAPHICS

### GRADE 8 AND 9/10

During this past year students who have been involved in Computer Graphics were offered a range of digital experiences to help them explore and gain a better understanding of the world of advertising, photography and 3D design.

The junior classes have been working through a range of tasks that are aimed at giving them confidence in both technical drawing and basic computer skills, such as Paint and Photoshop as well as design and layout skills. Students are given a range of challenges such as T-Shirt design, Flag design and Text art. In the next term we will explore Animation and 3D modelling when using programs such as Blender and Sketch up.

Grade 8 students have worked through a task aimed at providing a focus on problem solving. In a recent challenge, for example, students provided solutions in developing a flag for a new country located in the Pacific Ocean. Their flags were intended to unite the country after recent ethnic tensions. Students have been given the opportunity to study text and how it is modified for communicating messages and how typography is a changing science. Students designed their own text and were asked to compare the functionality of various text manipulation sites. A unit on photography and logo development saw a range of wonderful examples.

The senior classes primary focus this year was to engage students in the aspects of a logo design and the role of branding to identify the features of a business. Students developed a range of business logos and packaging whilst using programs such as Photoshop and Illustrator.

A unit on 3D development was offered to enable students a chance to apply 3D printing into design ideas and develop skills in animation and 3D rendering.

Finally, a housing unit will give senior students a chance to develop concepts and basic architectural skills that related to the average Australian house. Within that challenge students will develop ideas and models for a project that will benefit our school community using 3D modelling programs.



our school community. Keep being fabulous Maddie!




